



## WHAT TO PACK

There is a dress code. Everyone must wear a white t-shirt to work every day—that includes support and counselor staff, international and American, senior and junior. You are working with children, so must dress appropriately. Please pack accordingly. There is a weekly laundry service. Please do not bring items that require ironing or dry-cleaning. Overseas staff will be provided with all items in the first column (in bold) when they arrive at camp.

<b>2 blankets/quilts</b>	2 sweaters/sweatshirts	1 light jacket/fleece
<b>1 pillow</b>	2 pairs of sweatpants/pants	5 swimsuits
<b>4 sheets</b>	7 pairs of athletic shorts	2 pairs of sneakers (trainers)
<b>2 pillow cases</b>	*12 white T-shirts	1 rain jacket
<b>3 towels</b>	*12 pairs of socks	1 pair of sandals for the waterfront
	*12 pairs of underwear	1 water bottle

\*Overseas staff have sometimes found it more convenient to buy the bulk of these at the mall near camp. We will schedule time during Orientation to shop.

### **Please label all your belongings. You should also pack:**

- toiletries
- extra eyeglasses or contacts
- sunglasses
- camera
- small backpack for days off
- baseball cap
- flashlight
- insect repellent
- sunscreen
- watch
- some nice clothes for days off or nights out
- a “red, white & blue” outfit for 4<sup>th</sup> of July (optional)
- for girls: 1 green and 1 grey t-shirt to wear at special events (optional)

### **International staff may also want to bring the following:**

- credit card acceptable in the US (for personal travel and for Internet purchases/reservations)
- International Driver’s License (you may need this to hire a car on days off)

## **WHAT CAN YOU BRING AND NOT BRING TO CAMP?**

### **You can bring:**

- Laptops and electronic devices can only be used and stored in designated areas. Camp does not carry personal effects insurance, and these items are brought to camp at your own risk. We don’t want campers to have access to the internet, to electronic games, or to videos
- Small, battery-operated fans for next to the bed
- Blow dryers and other hair appliances are allowed, but their use is very restricted

### **Please leave these items at home:**

- drawers or bins that do not fit underneath the bed
- electrical appliances, hot pots, or any cooking equipment
- animals or weapons or explosives of any kind: BB guns, super-soaker water guns, fireworks
- first-aid medications, such as Tylenol or aspirin (the Health Center stocks these). It is against New York State law to keep medications (even over-the-counter ones) in cabins.

**Staff living with campers cannot keep food or beverages in their cabins or receive food packages (just like our campers).**
